\*\*\*Greetings\*\*\*

Today, I will present a model of support that the government of Jordan has adopted in the context of enabling micro, small, and medium enterprises in the country transform parts of their operations into digital.

- While we understand that e-commerce uses the alternative marketplace for business that is rapidly replacing traditional ones, and that it makes a justified "goal" in itself to be set for governments to promote transformation to it among the SMEs, but it generally takes other elements than upgrading SMEs capacities to e-commerce level to be tackled for an overall improved system where SMEs operate digitally.
- Therefore, Jordan has completed in 2021 an ereadiness assessment that covered analysis of the following components

 Still in this model, we are concerned with the role of support to build SMEs digital capacities. Therefore, starting from assessment projects like the e-readiness assessment that I just mentioned, we developed an SMEs support strategy for the years 2022-2025 where "digital transformation" and "smart enterprise" are two of 6 main pillars. We also designed and are in the process of designing several other support programs in the domain, and we implemented some of them already.

 The two main areas of intervention are in developing capacity in the e-commerce and digital marketing techniques, and developing transformational capacity in the Industry 4.0 components, which includes smart enterprises where devices and systems in a single industrial firm are connected and they communicate with each others and with other systems in the supply chain.

- This also requires two-folded capacity building approach; SMEs themselves and a pool of advisors to the SMEs.
- In addition, it involves direct financial assistance for a proof of concept

- The stages of support will commence in launching a Call for Proposals, where SMEs write concept notes on how they will use funds from the program into their digital transformation actions.
- These concepts notes will then be evaluated and filtered for a final short list of SMEs that will be supported.
- Implementation kicks off then in the usual process with agreements signed, officers assigned for mentoring and impact assessment.

- And finally, this is a quick look at Jordan Enterprise Development Corporation (JEDCO), which is the governmental organization that I represent and that is designing the support program and implementing it.
- JEDCO is an umbrella under which initiatives and support programs are designed and executed for the support of SMEs in general.
